#### Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> July:

Please pray for all the leaders as they make their final preparations for Spy Academy. This year in particular will be very different as the children will be in Bubbles and leaders will be wearing masks. Specifically remember the seventy+ children who will be attending and their parents.

Pray also for those who will watch online - that God will speak powerfully through technology. Most of all give thanks that we are able to be there in person this year.



#### Monday 26<sup>th</sup> July:

Remember the Outreach team as they seek to initiate conversations through masks and social distancing. Pray that God will break down barriers and that the team will be able to build up good relationships throughout the week. Guide them in their words and actions.

In Spy Academy the children are on a Mission – to find out more about Jesus and why He came to earth. Today's story is Jesus at the Temple (Luke 2: 41-52). The children will learn that even when Jesus was an ordinary boy growing up in Nazareth he had a special relationship with God His Father.



### Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> July:


In Day 2 the children will hear the story of the ten lepers (Luke 17: 11-19) and learn how Jesus was able to heal people through God's power. Today we are encouraging the children to say thank you to people who have helped them. We also want to remember those who are ill or lonely at this time.

During snack time each day we will ask the boys and girls for their prayer requests so that our team and you as a congregation can pray. It has been such a difficult year for many and we want our children and parents to know that God cares for every single one of them.

#### Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> July:

In today's investigation the Spy Kids will discover that Jesus used his amazing power to perform miracles. The story we are looking at in Mark 4: 35-41 is how Jesus calmed the storm. Give thanks for the drama team who have been able to bring these stories to life for the children and also for Josh who has used his talents so creatively to put our online club together.

Pray also for our church families as they spend time together in the summer and also for those who are still fearful or anxious about going out into the community again.



#### Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> July:

It is so difficult in one week to cover the entire life of Jesus but today we focus on the story of the Good Samaritan to show how Jesus cared for others and how He wants us to do the same. We will also look at the question asked by the ruler, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Pray for our leaders as they share this with the children.

Thank God for all who have been placed in a caring role and who so tirelessly look after others. As believers pray for opportunities to go the extra mile and reach out in love to those whom God places in our path.

#### Friday 30<sup>th</sup> July:

In Day 5 the Spy Kids reach the end of their mission – to find out why Jesus came to earth. Please remember those telling today's story the climax of the week – to explain how Jesus died for them and then miraculously rose again. His Mission was to save the world! Today we want to share with the children how they have Jesus as their special friend by giving their lives to Him. Pray that the seeds will be sown and come to fruition.



#### Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> July:

Give thanks for an amazing week with the children. Although the numbers have been smaller than usual, this has been a blessing in many ways. It has been a privilege to share with the children and their families and get to know them throughout the week. Pray that many of them will attend our Sunday Service and feel God's love through the Worship and the message that Cecil will bring.

Finally pray for ourselves as a congregation looking to the future... that God would guide us as to how we can encourage and help each other to come joyfully together again as God's family.


