Pakistan borders Iran, Afghanistan, China and India and has a coastline along the Arabian Sea. A population of 252 million makes it the fifth most populated country in the world. Over 60% of the people live in rural areas. Most are Muslim and they speak English and Urdu.

Pray for Christians in Pakistan, who make up less than 2% of the population. Pray that they would be safe and that they would be able to openly worship and serve God.

Food is aromatic and spicy. Dishes vary according to region, but rice and flatbreads called roti or chapati are eaten with most meals. Herbs and spices are used in most dishes. Chicken and mutton are the most common meats. Lassi and black tea are popular drinks. Give thanks for Rev Reuben Qamar, Moderator of the Presbyterian Church of Pakistan, as he seeks to provide godly and effective leadership amidst challenging times. Pray also for all the endeavours of the church and its pastors, not least through outreach, church planting, and in women's and youth ministries.

Geography: Pakistan sits on the Indian and the Eurasian plates and thus experiences many violent earthquakes. Pakistan has hot summers and cool winters. It is generally very dry. Winds called monsoons bring some rain in the summer. Pakistan's highest mountain K2 is the second highest mountain in the world, after Mount Everest.

Pray for people who have lost their homes and their jobs because of floods. Pray that they would be able to rebuild their lives and would know that God is close to them.

Wildlife: Sheep and goats are common animals, found in many regions. There are also wildcats, mongooses, porcupines, deer, civets, jackals and wild boar. The Indian pangolin can still be seen in southern plains and there are mugger crocodiles in the Indus river. Brown bears, black Himalayan bears, wild sheep, and snow leopards live in the northern mountains. The area near the mouth of the Indus River has crocodiles, pythons and wild boar. Jackals, foxes, wildcats, and many rodents and reptiles live throughout the country. Pray for organisations like PakMission Society and Tearfund who help those affected by floods. Pray that they would have all they need to support the people who need help.

Agriculture provides raw materials for some of Pakistan's most important industries. Pakistan sells cotton cloth and clothing to other countries. Workers make carpets out of wool and leather goods from hides and skins. Other industries in Pakistan make fertilizers, processed foods and cement. The country is abundant in fuel resources, including natural gas, petroleum oil, coal and hydropower potential. Home to one of the largest irrigation systems in the world, Pakistan can grow many crops. Fishing also plays an important role in the economy. Farmers also raise goats, sheep, cattle and water buffalo.

Pray for the United Bible Training College in Gujranwala, particularly for the women and girls who are doing the Bible courses, that they would be equipped well to serve God.
